Luís Sanchez-Rosa Abundant Life has been blessed to have Luís Sanchez-Rosa on staff since January as Middle School Tutoring Coordinator and Fellow. Luís holds an Associate Degree in Business Administration from Piedmont Virginia Community College and a BA in Sociology from Covenant College.

Luís is a very familiar face to us; he moved to Prospect Avenue in 2002 and started in our programs in 2005. He progressed through Johnson, Walker, and Buford Tutoring, as well as the 5/8 Club and Discipleship. As a charter member of STRIVE, Luís was one of its first graduates (Charlottesville High School Class of 2014).

During high school and college, Luís had several stints on staff, as a 5/8 Club Summer Program intern (twice) and as the Buford Tutoring Coordinator in 2015-16. He thanks staff members and mentors Dylan Rosenthal, Richard Feero, and many more men for the values they instilled in him that continue to shape his life. Luís says he's "blessed to be giving back to the community that poured so much into my growth."

Pandemic Leads to Program Pivots

Abundant Life is a holistic community development organization, so when a pandemic hit, we sought to remain true to our mission while also engaging in the relief efforts that our community needed. We balanced these goals by partnering with Community Meals (with funding from World Central Kitchen in partnership with Frontline Foods), Cville Community Cares, and DSA Charlottesville to distribute 5,100 meals in the Prospect neighborhood. Other partnerships included working with Loaves & Fishes, which donated excess fruits and vegetables that we could distribute, utilizing funds received from the Charlottesville Area Community Foundation to expand our virtual learning support programs, and assisting our neighbors in accessing emergency COVID-19 funds.

Online classes have led to adjustments in all our academic programs. Instead of the usual after-school tutoring, we are partnering with Christ Episcopal Church to offer in-person support to our elementary students four days a week. Meanwhile, we are providing in-person programming for our middle schoolers at Buford Middle School. Due to the pandemic we have three Fellows, who each focus their efforts on supporting these academic programs.




First-Generation College Graduate and Family Man

Paul Fry, III joined Abundant Life in 2001 as a first grader. "My mother was a single parent raising four kids on her own, living in a three-bedroom apartment and [working] two jobs, so it was hard for her to keep up with us and make sure we did all of our homework. Abundant Life became a big factor because they gave my mother the help she needed; they provided us with school supplies, tutors and mentors that we could hang out with after school."

Paul progressed through our programs: Tutoring, Bible Club, the 5/8 Club, Walker and Buford Tutoring, and served as a summer intern and camp counselor in high school. Then, Paul joined STRIVE as one of three participants in its pilot program, becoming one of its first two graduates in 2013.

As a first-generation college student, Paul worked to put himself through two years of PVCC and 4.5 years at Radford University. In 2016, he hosted STRIVE students for a campus tour and Q&A, no doubt inspiring them to see themselves as college students someday. In 2018, he married his high school sweetheart and fellow Radford student Taya and together they had a daughter, Genesis. With all of these responsibilities, and while working full-time at a juvenile detention center, Paul (and Taya) graduated from Radford in December 2019!
